January


15th January 2022 - Saturday Sessions: Season Two; Joy: A Community Building Tool

Rotary E-Club of Innovation: A very special speaker meeting "Hear the news live from Rotary in Kyiv"



27/06/22 - 01/07/22- Eutopia Week; Organised by VUB University, Belgium





We had our seventh EYT Monthly meeting at the end of August, we welcomed several new members and, again, discussed upcoming projects and initiatives for 2022.







"The Future of Humanity" - Rotaract Atlanta Metro - 15th Oct 2022







The state of the African state: Where has it come from and where is it going?

Dr Nick Westcott, Oxford Martin Visiting Fellow

Monday 21 November 2022, 5pm - 6.15pm GMT

African states have been in flux since long before colonial powers carved up the continent into bite-sized chunks at the end of the 19th century. In the 60 years since most became independent, new trends have emerged. Some have reflected history, both colonial and precolonial, from ethnic rivalries and migrating populations to authoritarian structures, extractive institutions and irrational borders. Others reflect new dynamics both local and global - economic imbalances, demographic dynamism, changing climate and a changing balance of global power. But in particular there is a shift in the ideological basis of the state: how do people view it, what do they expect and what do governments think they should do? This is a joint event with the Oxford Martin Programme on African Governance.

Oxford Martin School - 'The Age of the strongman: populism and authoritarianism in global politics'

Panel Discussion 'The age of the strongman: populism and authoritarianism in global politics'

Lord Patten of Barnes, Gideon Rachman, Professor Margaret MacMillan & Professor Ricardo Soares de Oliveira Monday 28 November 2022, 5pm – 6.30pm GMT

Since the beginning of the millennium, when Vladimir Putin took power in Russia, authoritarian leaders have come to dominate global politics. Self-styled strongmen have risen to power in Moscow, Beijing, Delhi, Brasilia, Budapest, Ankara, Riyadh and Washington. These leaders are nationalists and social conservatives, with little tolerance for minorities, dissent or the interests of foreigners. At home, they encourage a cult of personality and claim to stand up for ordinary people against globalist elites; abroad, they posture as the embodiments of their nations. And they are not just operating in authoritarian political systems but have begun to emerge in the heartlands of liberal democracy.

This panel's distinguished speakers will address the following questions: How and why did this new style of strongman leadership arrive? How likely is it to lead to global war or economic collapse? Most pressingly, we will be asking: are liberal societies, beset by internal turmoil and their own strongman dynamics, capable of checking and reversing this trend?

Another online event run by the Oxford Martin School, this time it was a panel event with guests such as Lord Patten of Barnes, Gideon Rachman, Professor Margaret MacMillan and Professor Ricardo Soares de Oliveria. The event was focusing on the 'strongman'-type of leadership in various countries across the world.

29th November 2022 - Oxford Martin School - 'Drop-in Fuels from Sunlight and Air'

Drop-in fuels from sunlight and air Professor Aldo Steinfeld, Chair of Renewable Energy Carriers, ETH Zurich

Tuesday 29 November 2022, 5pm - 6.15pm GMT

Developing solar technologies for producing carbon-neutral transportation fuels has become a global energy challenge, especially for the long-haul aviation sector. A promising solution are drop-in fuels produced from H2O and CO2 – synthetic alternatives for petroleum-derived liquid hydrocarbons such as kerosene, gasoline or diesel, which are compatible with the worldwide existing infrastructures for fuel distribution, storage, and end-use. Professor Aldo Steinfeld, Chair of Renewable Energy Carriers at ETH Zurich, will describe the design and operation of the solar refinery for producing drop-in fuels from sunlight and air, which sets a technological milestone towards the industrial production of sustainable aviation fuels.
